

July BOM

Bug Jar Block

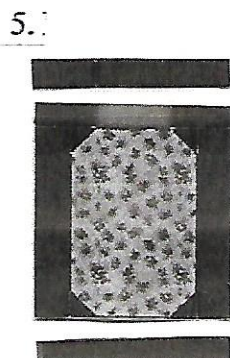
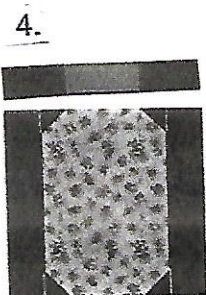
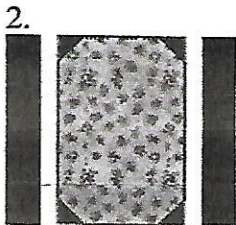
The finished block is 8" X 12"

From bug fabric cut 5 1/2" X 8" rectangle

From red fabric cut 2" X 3 1/2" rectangle

From Black fabric cut:

- 4 - 1 1/2" squares
- 2 - 2" X 3" rectangles for sides of jar lid
- 2 - 2" X 8" strips for block sides
- 2 - 2" X 8 1/2" strips for top and bottom



1. With right sides together, lay one black square in the corner of the bug print. Stitch from one corner of the black square to the opposite corner. Repeat with the other three corners. Trim and press towards the black fabric.

2. Sew the long edge of each 2" X 8" strips to the long sides of the bug fabric block created in step 1. Press towards the outside.

3. Sew the black 2" x 3" pieces to the sides of the red rectangle. Press towards the black.

4. Sew the jar lid block to the top of the bug fabric block.

5. Sew the top and bottom 2" x 8" strip to the top and bottom of the block.

*6. Press and trim to ~~8" x 12"~~ $8\frac{1}{2}" \times 12\frac{1}{2}"$ ← *note correction
