



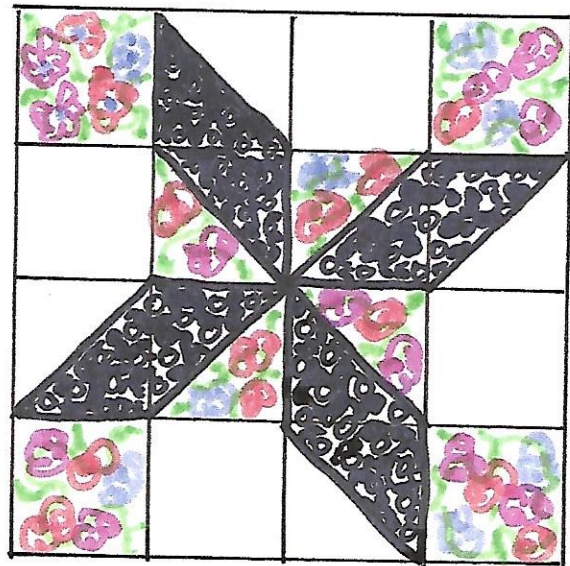

## "CLAY'S CHOICE" BOM FOR MARCH 2017 GAIL WILSON

This block should measure 12 ½" and will finish as a 12" block when stitched into a quilt.

### CUTTING FOR ONE BLOCK

Measure and cut accurately. Sew all seams ¼" seam allowance. Press all seams open.

1. From black with white dot cut: 4 - 3 7/8" squares
2. From any color bright kid print cut: 2 - 3 7/8" squares and 4 - 3 ½" squares
3. From a white solid or white on white cut 2 - 3 7/8" squares and 4 - 3 ½" squares

### CONSTRUCTION

1. Pair 2 - 3 7/8" black with white dot squares with 2 - 3 7/8" kid print squares right sides together.
2. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the paired square – whichever one the line will show up on.
3. Stitch ¼" on each side of the drawn line. Cut square on center drawn line between stitched lines. You should have 4 dot/kid units.
4. Pair the other 2 - 3 7/8" black dot squares with 2 3 7/8" white squares right sides together. Repeat steps 2 and 3 above. You should have 4 dot/white units.
5. Press ALL seams OPEN
6. Stitch the units together into rows using the picture as a guide. Trim off dog ears.
7. Stitch the rows together to finish the block.
